The End of Session is Near

Today marks the 20th Legislative Day (out of 29) for this 2021 Legislative Session - Sine Die will be on March 30th. You can expect movement to really pick up this week in Frankfort. Of course, the major issue the legislature still has left to tackle is the budget.

Now that the bill filing deadline has come and gone, time has come to turn our attention to committee substitutes and amendments, as well as the supported and opposed legislation that we are already keeping a close eye on.

During last Friday's (2/26) Legislative Quick Response Team (QRT), the QRT voted to support six new pieces of legislation. These are HB 570, HB 587, HB 588, SB 100, SB 125, and SB 264.

HB 570 (Meade, D):

This bill establishes the Kentucky Emergency Rental Assistance Fund and provides for its administration and funding. If a state emergency is declared that exceeds 30 days and includes a cease on evictions, \$5 million will be put into the Assistance Fund. The \$5million will come from the Budget Reserve Trust Fund.

HB 587/HB 588/SB 100/SB 125 (Fleming/Stivers):

This bipartisan bill would offer investment and economic solutions to Louisville's West End neighborhoods of Parkland, Shawnee, Park Duvalle, Russell, Portland, California, Chickasaw, Park Hill, and Algonquin. Key elements of the legislation include measures to attract investment, prevent displacement of current residents due to increasing housing values, creation of a tax incremental financing program and development area, and creation of a board to oversee investment opportunities and neighborhood initiatives.

SB 264 (West, S):

This bill would forbid a governmental entity to prohibit or impose other restrictions on evictions or foreclosure for nonpayment of rent during a state of emergency.

Other bills that moved forward in the legislative process last week include:

- HB 172 (Appraisers Board) Passed out of House Licensing and Occupations Committee
- HB 207 (Fossil Fuels) Passed on the House floor and is headed to the Senate
- HB 340 (Radon Safety Board) Passed out of House Licensing and Occupations Committee
- SB 10 (Commission on Race & Access to Opportunity Passed on the Senate Flood, headed to House.
- SB 11 (Damage to Rental Property) Has already passed the Senate, in House Licensing and Occupations on Wednesday.
- SB 243 (County Clerks) In Senate Judiciary Committee today for discussion only.

HB151 RECORDED INSTRUMENTS (FISCHER, JOSEPH M.)

AN ACT relating to recorded instruments.

Create a new section of KRS Chapter 67 to define "recorded instrument" and "portal"; require county clerks to be open for reviewing and obtaining copies of recorded instruments for 40 hours a week unless they maintain a portal that allows the public to search for electronic copies of recorded instruments; establish deadlines for county clerks to maintain portals for the filing and searching of recorded instruments.

HB172 KENTUCKY REAL ESTATE APPRAISERS BOARD (FRAZIER,

DEANNA)

AN ACT relating to the Kentucky Real Estate Appraisers Board.

Amend KRS 324A.015 to require the board to employ state-certified general appraisers with at least five years of experience to conduct grievance investigations; amend KRS

324A.035 to make technical corrections; amend KRS 324A.047 and 324A.050 to clarify standards; amend KRS 324A.052 to require complaints to be filed within five years after the date of transmittal of the appraisal report or review assignment or at least two years after the final disposition of any judicial proceeding that the appraiser provided testimony related to the assignment; amend KRS 324A.065 to require the initial application fee to not exceed \$200 for federally related transactions; require the annual certificate and licensure fees to not exceed \$200 for federally related transactions; establish a returned check fee of \$50 for federally related transactions; eliminate the initial application fee, examination fee, duplicate certificate fee, and roster fee for nonfederally related transactions; require the board to promulgate administrative regulations to establish and collect a prelicensure fee not to exceed \$100 and a continuing education course review fee not to exceed \$50; amend KRS 324A.150 to include a network, list, or roster of licensed or certified appraisers to the definition of "appraiser panel"; amend KRS 324A.152 to require an appraisal management company to certify that it is not partly or fully owned by an appraiser whose license has been disciplined; amend KRS 324A.154 to require the board to promulgate administrative regulations with the approval of the executive director of the Kentucky Real Estate Authority; amend KRS 324A.164 to exclude a federally defined "federally regulated appraisal management company" from the appraisal management company statutes.

utility regulated by the Public Service Commission under KRS Chapter 278 or is otherwise incorporated under KRS Chapter 279.

AN ACT relating to emergencies and making an appropriation therefor.

Create new sections of KRS Chapter 198A to establish the Kentucky emergency rental assistance fund and provide for its administration and funding; set out the requirements for the use of the Kentucky emergency rental assistance fund; amend KRS 39A.100 to limit the Governor from suspending or modifying KRS Chapter 383 or KRS 65.875 during an emergency; amend KRS 214.020 to limit the actions taken by the Cabinet for Health and Family Services during an epidemic to 30 days unless extended by the General Assembly.

AN ACT relating to property in a development area.

Create new sections in KRS Chapter 65 to state findings and declaration of the General Assembly for the development area; define terms; establish the West End Opportunity Partnership, its powers and duties and purpose; require the West End Opportunity Partnership to comply with open meetings and open records requirements; require the West End Opportunity Partnership to reimburse real property taxes; establish the board and membership requirements; require a local participation agreement and specify provisions of the agreement; establish requirements pertaining to documentation, records, incremental revenues, and bonds; require reporting of the West End Opportunity Partnership to the Interim Joint Committee on Appropriations and Revenue; establish the West End Louisville Advisory Council and its members and duties; create a new section in KRS Chapter 132 to establish the classification of residential property in a revitalization area; define terms; and prohibit the legislative body of a consolidated local government from levying an ad valorem tax rate on residential property in a revitalization area that is higher than 50 percent of the prevailing rate of other real property located in its jurisdiction; EFFECTIVE only if 2021 Regular Session Bill Request Number 1454 becomes law.

HB595 RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS OF LANDLORDS AND TENANTS TO A RESIDENTIAL LEASE (KULKARNI, NIMA)

AN ACT concerning rights and obligations of landlords and tenants to a residential lease.

Repeal and reenact and create new sections of KRS Chapter 383 to enact the Uniform Residential Landlord and Tenant Act and apply it across the Commonwealth; repeal various sections of KRS Chapter 383 to conform.

Create a new section of KRS Chapter 7 to establish a Commission on Race and Access to Opportunity; define "commission"; set forth the membership of the commission; authorize the authority to hold monthly meetings, seek comment and testimony, and provide research driven policy proposals; and require the commission to publish an annual report.

AN ACT relating to property in a development area.

Create new sections in KRS Chapter 65 to state findings and declaration of the General Assembly for the development area; define terms; establish the West End Opportunity Partnership, its powers and duties and purpose; require the West End Opportunity Partnership to comply with open meetings and open records requirements; require the West End Opportunity Partnership to reimburse real property taxes; establish the board and membership requirements; require a local participation agreement and specify provisions of the agreement; establish requirements pertaining to documentation, records, incremental revenues, and bonds; require reporting of the West End Opportunity Partnership to the Interim Joint Committee on Appropriations and Revenue; establish the West End Louisville Advisory Council and its members and duties; create a new section in KRS Chapter 132 to establish the classification of residential property in a revitalization area; define terms; and prohibit the legislative body of a consolidated local government from levying an ad valorem tax rate on residential property in a revitalization area that is higher than 50 percent of the prevailing rate of other real property located in its jurisdiction; EFFECTIVE only if 2021 Regular Session Bill Request Number 850 becomes law.

SB121 RESIDENTIAL COMMUNITIES (ALVARADO, RALPH)

AN ACT relating to residential communities.

Create new sections of KRS Chapter 381 to define terms related to planned communities; establish administrative standards for planned communities; provide standards for declarations for planned communities; indicate that planned communities shall have a declaration accompanied by bylaws that include specific provisions; provide that associations shall have an executive board with enumerated powers; allow periods of declarant control of the associations; provide for rights and responsibilities of associations; require associations to keep certain financial records; allow associations to assess lot owners for certain expenses; allow associations to have a lien upon any lot for nonpayment of assessments; provide guidelines for revitalization of defunct associations; establish guidelines for civil liabilities; define "governing documents" and "homeowners' association"; state that the governing documents may not prohibit the outdoor display of political yard signs 30 days before any special, primary, or regular election until seven days after that election; establish a short title.
