KYR Legislative Bill Tracker 2025 Legislative Priorities

The second week of the legislative session has been highly active, with the QRT reviewing various legislative proposals affecting the Kentucky real estate industry. The team has recognized many important pieces of legislation to monitor and has voted to support one newly introduced bill: HB356. Additionally, the QRT has voted to oppose two additional bills. These actions align with our organization's purpose to further the real estate industry, support our members, and benefit all Kentuckians. This advancement depicts our commitment to advancing a strong real estate industry, and the QRT will continue to monitor and address legislation throughout the session. Supported Bills (1):

HB356 (Bridges, R)

Amend KRS 132.380 to require the examination of candidates for the office of property valuation administrator to be offered by the Kentucky Community and Technical College System (KCTCS); require the Department of Revenue to provide KCTCS with examination questions and other relevant examination information; establish the examination period; require KCTCS to work with the department to promulgate administrative regulations for the examination registration and establishment of fees; require KCTCS to provide the

Department of Revenue information from a candidate's examination for purposes of determining if the candidate passed the examination; establish a deadline for the Department of Revenue to issue a certificate of fitness and qualification to candidates who passed the examination; make technical corrections.
