

KYR Legislative Update – 3/23/2026

During the eleventh week of the 2026 Regular Session, the General Assembly remained focused on finalizing the state's spending plan. With both the Senate and House having passed their respective budget proposals, the process now moves to a state budget conference committee in each respective chamber to reconcile the differences between the two versions. We expect the conference committees to continue their work into next week.

Eight legislative days remain in the 2026 Regular Session making this the final opportunity for lawmakers to advance legislation. Constitutionally, the legislature must adjourn no later than April 15th, and the last day of session before the veto period begins is April 1st. Legislative activity has ramped up – several bills have already been sent to Governor Beshear, with many others still awaiting agreement between the two chambers. We anticipate that numerous bills focusing on housing will be rolled into one omnibus package, as this session saw a high volume of proposals focused around making home ownership more accessible.
